
#### YOUR PERSONAL EQUITY PORTFOLIO



#### PORTFOLIO MANAGER'S COMMENTS

The recovery in equity prices both locally and globally continued in relentless fashion during the month of March, as selective equity market indexes recorded new all-time highs. In SA, shares – as measured by the FTSE/JSE All Share Index (ALSI) – advanced by another 1.6% in March while recording a 13.1% return for the first quarter of the 2021 calendar year. Off a very low base following the sell-off in March last year, local equities have returned 54% over 12 months and a whopping 85.8% in US dollar terms over the period. Globally, equities were up by 3.4% in the month and 5% for the first quarter. Emerging market equities lagged somewhat, depreciating by 1.5% in the month to close the quarter 2.3% higher.

Once again, it was a month with extreme divergence in the performance of the respective equity sectors. Gold shares added 12.6%, and platinum counters traded 8.8% higher. The real stars were SA-specific sectors, with the automobile and parts sector adding a remarkable 24.5% in the month and mobile telecommunication trading 13.7% in the blue. Despite the good performance of the precious metal producers, general miners lagged with a negative return of 4.8%, and life assurance also gave up 4%.

Cash returned a modest 0.33% in the month and only 4.5% over 12 months. Long bonds in SA were under pressure (-2.5%) in March as global bond yields weakened. Property continued a hesitant recovery, gaining 1.2% in the month and 6.4% on a year-on-year basis.

The Shariah portfolio returned 3.61% (benchmark: 3.55%) in March. No changes were made to the portfolio during the month.
